


Headteacher's **Update**

Royal Society of Chemistry Olympiad

Lily M in Year 12 took part in the Chemistry Olympiad last term. This is an extremely challenging competition for A level chemistry students that goes beyond the A level curriculum. We are pleased to announce that Lily achieved a gold certificate, which is the highest award possible. This is an exceptional achievement and places her in the top 8% of the almost 15000 students who entered across the country. Well done, Lily!

Theme of the Week

Our overall focus for this next term is 'healthy lives'. We started the new term with a specific focus on healthy time-management and why that's important for all of us in our day-to-day lives. Year 10 Exam Week

Next week is the Year 10 end of year exams. These exams take place in the Sports Hall in the same conditions students as their GCSE exams. The reason is so they can begin to get used to doing formal exams and so we can assess how they are progressing in their studies. It is important students take these seriously and follow all the rules of the exams. It is also important that they bring the appropriate equipment for the exams.

Students will have an exam timetable. When they do not have an exam they will be in normal lessons. I would advise they bring some revision resources to school in case they have time in lessons to revise for the next exam.

Students will register on the MUGA and then enter the exam rooms for the morning and afternoon sessions. If it is raining heavily, students will register in form rooms and then be brought to the exams by their tutor.

Everything at school stays the same for as long as possible. Students must attend every day and at the usual times.

We believe routine is important and that time spent in school is invaluable for students. **Students will not be allowed to study at home and are expected in everyday, for the whole day up to Friday 24th May.** This includes when exams start. We will keep a normal timetable running but will also adapt it so that students can have a targeted revision session on the day before or the morning before an exam. Students will receive a timetable for this next week. From our experience, this is the best pattern for year 11s.

Uniform stays the same.

Students are expected to always wear their full uniform when on site, this includes when taking exams. The only exception that will be allowed is that students may wear their leavers hoodie once it has been issued on Friday 3rd May. This can be worn in place of, or in addition to, the blazer. Whenever a student attends for an exam they must be wearing their full school uniform to gain access to the exam hall.

Other key information:

Friday 3rd May – Year 11 celebration

This is the last Friday before exams start the following week (Thursday 9th). On this day there will be a special service, an assembly run by the Head of year and form tutors, as well as the opportunity to have some food together. If a leavers hoodie has been ordered, this will be given out then. The following Tuesday 7th May (Monday is a bank holiday) is a normal school day and students should be in full school uniform and attend at the usual time. **Students will be dismissed from school at 1pm on the 3rd May.**

Plan for the Year 11 celebration, Friday 3rd May

- Arrive in school for 8:30am as usual in school uniform.
- Leavers' Worship Service in the Sports Hall, in place of morning tutor at 8:30am
- Normal periods 1 and 2 and morning break.
- NO SHIRT SIGNING UNTIL MORNING BREAK (students will be sent home to get changed if they do not adhere to this). Consider what is drawn/written nothing prejudiced or offensive is allowed.
- 11am Leavers' Assembly in the Sports Hall
- 12:00pm Leavers' picnic on grassed area to south of MUGA/football.

1:00pm – Dismissal for weekend of revision

Brighton and Sussex Medical School - May Monthly Lecture – Wednesday 1 May

May's Monthly Lecture is 'The harms of prescribing: Polypharmacy, Deprescribing, and conducting research at medical school' from Harmanleen Singh.

Harmanleen Singh will discuss how prescribing medications can cause harms in patients with a high medication burden, and the importance of deprescribing potentially inappropriate medications. He will also discuss getting involved in research at medical school, including his experience of conducting an Independent Research Project on Deprescribing, presenting research at conferences, and publications.

Harmanleen Singh is an incoming doctor, graduating from BSMS in June 2024. He is a Teaching Mentor with the BSMS Outreach Team, a Student and Foundation Doctor Representative at the Royal College of Physicians and a Vice-Chair of the Overcome Research Ethics Board, pursuing his interests in research, medical education, and widening participation in medicine.

This lecture will be delivered online via the Zoom platform from 6:30pm – 7:30pm.


