- The information below identifies the main subject topic areas used as the primary focus of questions in the 2022 assessments.

Focus of the June 2022 exam

Section A: The study of religions

8061/1 Buddhism

- The Three Marks of Existence:
 - anicca (impermanence).
- The Buddha's life and its significance:
 - the Buddha's Enlightenment.
- The Four Noble Truths:
 - the causes of suffering (samudaya).
- Ethical teachings:
 - The five moral precepts:
 - do not take life
 - do not take what is given

- do not misuse the senses
- do not speak falsehoods
- do not take intoxicants that cloud the mind.
- The six perfections in the Mahayanan tradition:
 - generosity
 - morality
 - patience
 - energy
 - meditation
 - wisdom, including how the individuals develop these perfections within themselves.

8061/2 Christianity

- The nature of God:
 - the oneness of God and the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- Different Christian beliefs about the afterlife and their importance, including: resurrection and life after death; judgement, heaven and hell.
- · Beliefs and teachings about:
 - the crucifixion, resurrection and ascension
 - sin, including original sin
 - the means of salvation, including law, grace and Spirit
 - the role of Christ in salvation including the idea of atonement.

8061/3 Islam

- The six articles of faith in Sunni Islam and five roots of Usul ad-Din in Shi'a Islam, including key similarities and differences.
- Tawhid (the Oneness of God), Qur'an Surah 112.
- The nature of God:
 - omnipotence, beneficence, mercy, fairness and justice/Adalat in Shi'a Islam, including different ideas about God's relationship with the world: immanence and transcendence.
- Akhirah (life after death), human responsibility and accountability, resurrection, heaven and hell.
- The holy books:
 - Qur'an: revelation and authority
 - the Torah, the Psalms, the Gospel, the Scrolls of Abraham and their authority.

8061/4 Judaism

- The nature of God:
 - God as one
 - God as Creator
 - God as Law-Giver and Judge, loving and merciful.
- Beliefs about life after death, including judgement and resurrection.
- The importance of the sanctity of human life, including the concept of 'saving a life' (Pikuach Nefesh).
- Mitzvot between man and God and mitzvot between man and man, including the difference between them and their importance.
